English 9 ACTIVITIES:

Choose **one** of the following activities to complete after reading your selected book. End products will be turned in within the first two weeks of school.

- 1. Create a tri-fold brochure on one sheet of colored construction paper. The components of the tri-fold brochure will consist of the following items.
 - Front outside panel—title, author, and publisher
 - Inside left panel—setting (time and place)
 - Inside center panel—illustration of setting
 - Inside right panel—summary of the story
 - Left outside panel—a review based on evidence from the novel (Would you recommend it to fellow students? Why or why not?)
 - Center outside panel—name, date, period of student
- 2. Create a booklet consisting of an illustrated cover and a summary of the entire novel on the back page. Inside, the booklet will have illustrated pages that cover the following information found in the novel.
 - Cover—Illustration with novel title, author, publisher
 - Page 1—Main characters and a brief description of each
 - Page 2—Main settings and a brief description of each
 - Page 3—Brief descriptions of the conflict, climax, and resolution
 - Page 4—Your review of the novel (Would you recommend it to fellow students? Why or why not?)
 - Page 5—Summary of the novel; include student name, date, and class at the bottom of page 5
- 3. Write a three-page letter to the main character in the novel, giving him or her advice on an issue he/she faces in the novel. Relate in any way you can to the situation and try to help him or her.

- 2. Pick a character from the novel and create a collage representing his/ her personality. Use magazines and artwork to create your collage. (Poster is required; make sure to include the name of the character, the novel, etc.).
- 3. Create a newspaper that would be delivered to one of the characters in the novel you read. You can include want ads, advertisements, sports section, business section, lifestyle section, crossword puzzles, horoscopes, etc. Make sure to write three major stories and include graphics.
