



Summer Reading Assessment-students will complete a "one-pager" on their book. A one pager is a single-page response to your reading. It is a way of making your pattern of your unique understanding. It is a way to be creative and experimental. It is a way to respond imaginatively and honestly. ... The purpose of a one-pager is to own what you are reading. Here is an example of a one-pager for the book *Wonder*:




Students should include quotations, ideas, images, analysis, key names and dates, all on a **2' x 3' poster board**. Use text, color, drawings, and pictures to name the important THEMES of the book. There should be at least **5 important quotes** from the books which focus on the MAIN EVENTS in the book. 
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
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**10**th **Grade Summer Reading**: Students should choose to read ONE of the following:

Posters should be <u>neat</u>, <u>colorful</u>, and <u>legible</u>. **Assignment is due on the second** day of class for extra credit.


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
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
11th Grade Summer Reading: Students should choose to read ONE of the following:


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
